On behalf of the faculty and staff of the School, I congratulate you on your upcoming graduation. We are confident you have gained the knowledge to be successful in your future engineering career. There are two important events to celebrate your commencement, and I encourage you to attend both, along with your family and friends.

The first is the University of New Mexico's Spring 2019 Commencement Program, which will take place on Saturday, May 11, at 9:00 a.m. in the Dreamstyle Arena (better known to you as "The Pit"). UNM President Garnett Stokes will preside over this ceremony, which I expect to be well-attended by faculty, staff, and students, all of whom will be in academic regalia (i.e., cap and gown). The second event is the School of Engineering Spring 2019 Convocation. This will take place on Saturday, May 11, 2019 at 7:00 p.m. in the Dreamstyle Arena. The Convocation is the School's own ceremony specifically to honor you, in the presence of your family and friends. The highlight of this event is the recognition of each SOE graduate individually on stage, where you will be congratulated by your department faculty and staff, your deans, and the Convocation's honored guests. Graduate students will be met on the stage by their faculty thesis/dissertation advisor for the traditional "hooding" ceremony. If you plan to attend the SOE Convocation, please report to the PIT **between 6:00 p.m. and 6:45 p.m.** in order to receive your data information card and line up for the procession. Look for signs pointing you to the student check-in area. All students and guests may enter the PIT only through the northeast doors.

Cap and gown is the appropriate dress for graduates. "Civilian" dress is also acceptable. Caps and gowns can be obtained from the UNM Bookstore (<https://bookstore.unm.edu/c-209-graduation.aspx>). If you wish to send formal announcements to your family and friends, you can purchase them at the bookstore as well.

Wheelchair access to the PIT is available, but wheelchairs for guests may not come to the floor. There is seating for those with accessibility issues on the main level of the PIT seating. If you need special accommodations such as an interpreter for yourself or your guests or if you are a graduate in a wheelchair or with accessibility issues, please contact April Davidson at 277-1421 prior to May 3, 2019.

Immediately following the ceremony, please join us for a short reception where you and your guests can mingle with your fellow graduates and faculty before taking those next big steps into your careers.
